



**Priest** We give you thanks and praise, almighty God, through your beloved Son, Jesus Christ, our Saviour and Redeemer. He is your living Word, through whom you have created all things. By the power of the Holy Spirit he took flesh of the Virgin Mary and shared our human nature. He lived and died as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all. 

COLLECT OF THE DAY - *Sixth Sunday after Pentecost - Canada Day*

Almighty God, whose wisdom and whose love are over all, accept the prayers we offer for our nation. Give integrity to its citizens and wisdom to those in authority, that harmony and justice may be secured in obedience to your will; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

FIRST READING - *Isaiah 32.1-5, 16-18*

See, a king will reign in righteousness, and princes will rule with justice. <sup>2</sup>Each will be like a hiding-place from the wind, a covert from the tempest, like streams of water in a dry place, like the shade of a great rock in a weary land. <sup>3</sup>Then the eyes of those who have sight will not be closed, and the ears of those who have hearing will listen. <sup>4</sup>The minds of the rash will have good judgement, and the tongues of stammerers will speak readily and
